# WHAT AREAS ARE TESTED?

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In addition to the completion of course credits, students must earn points toward graduation on **seven** end-of-course exams. The courses in which students take an end-of-course exam are:

ELA I (English 9)

ELA II (English 10)

Algebra I

Geometry

Biology

US History

Government

# WHAT DO MY SCORES MEAN?

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Students can earn from 1-5 points for each exam, based on performance.

5 – Advanced

4 – Accelerated

3 – Proficient

2 – Basic

1 – Limited

# HOW MANY POINTS DO I NEED?

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A minimum of <b>four points</b> on the 2 English tests	<b>+4</b>
A minimum of <b>four points</b> on the 2 math tests	<b>+4</b>
A minimum of <b>six points</b> on the 3 science and social studies tests	<b>+6</b>
Additional <b>four points</b> from any of the content areas	<b><u>+4</u></b>
A combined total of <b>eighteen points</b> from all areas	<b>= 18</b>

# WHAT IF I DON'T HAVE ENOUGH POINTS?

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If you are below the required number of points in any of the areas after taking all tests, you are in danger of NOT graduating high school. You **MUST** retake tests to improve your score.

Students are placed in intervention where they can prepare to retake tests. Test retakes are in December and April each year. Only the higher score between the original score and retake score is calculated into the total points.

# WHAT'S NEXT?

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Fill out the Graduation Test Points google sheet with the help of your advisory teacher. Save the sheet to your drive so you will always have access to your scores.

Decide which tests you would like to retake in December. Fill out and submit the December AIR Test Retakes google form . (You may be required to take additional tests based on your choices and current point count)

**Note:**\* If you have an IEP, you may be exempted from the consequences of not passing the tests. See a counselor if you have questions about this.
